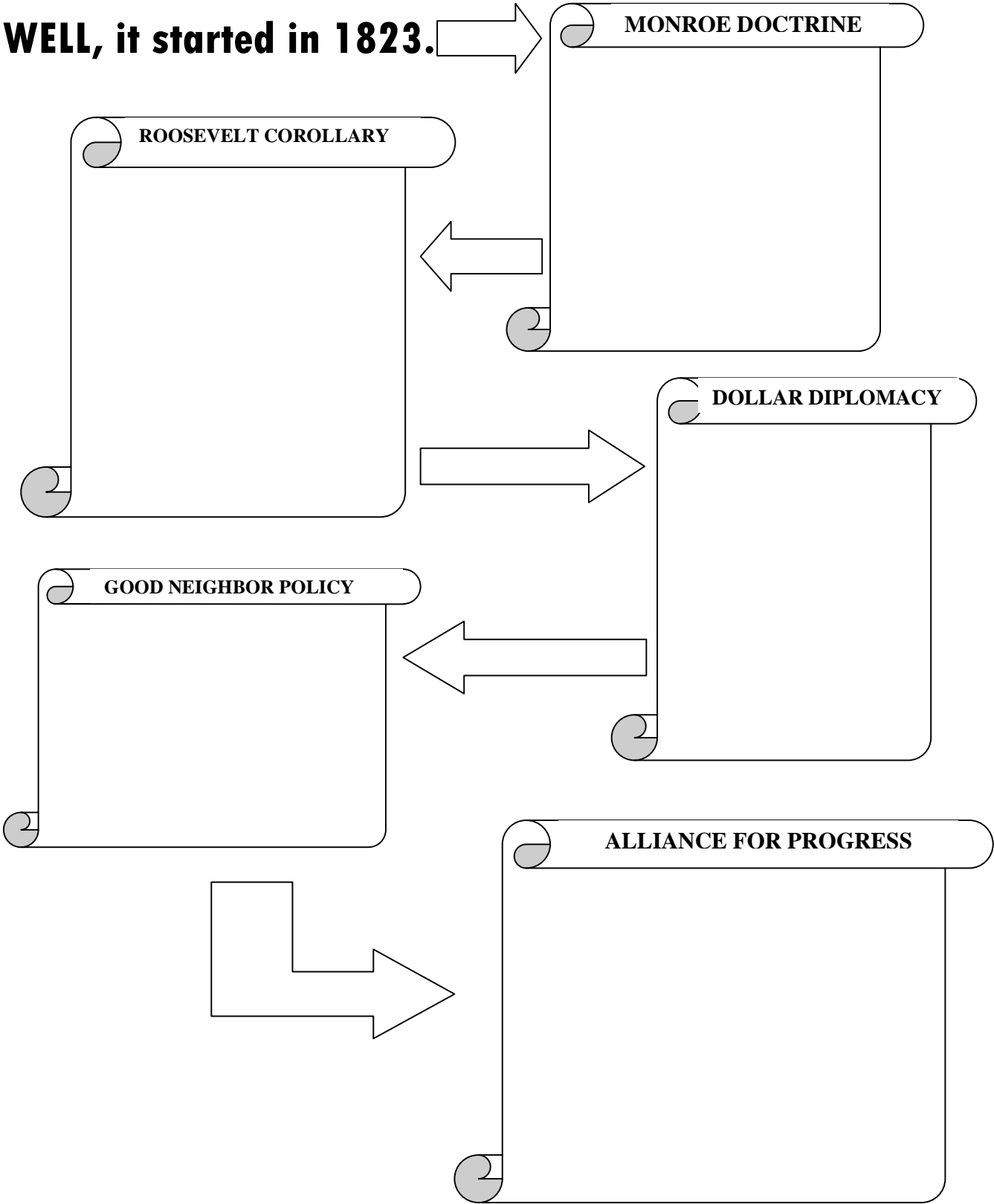

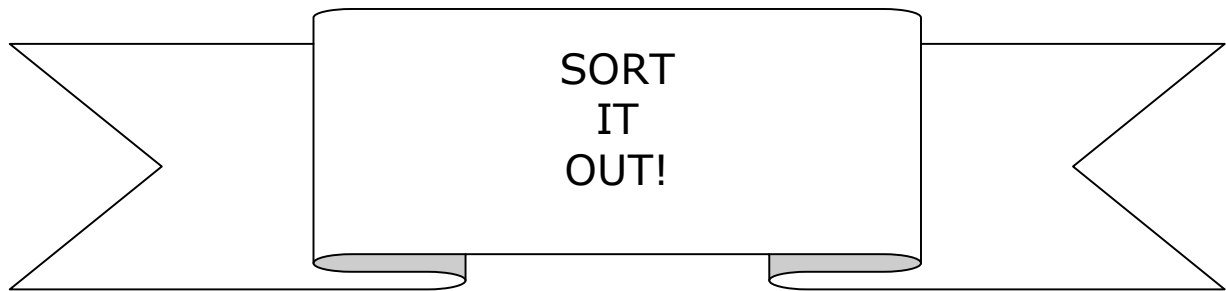

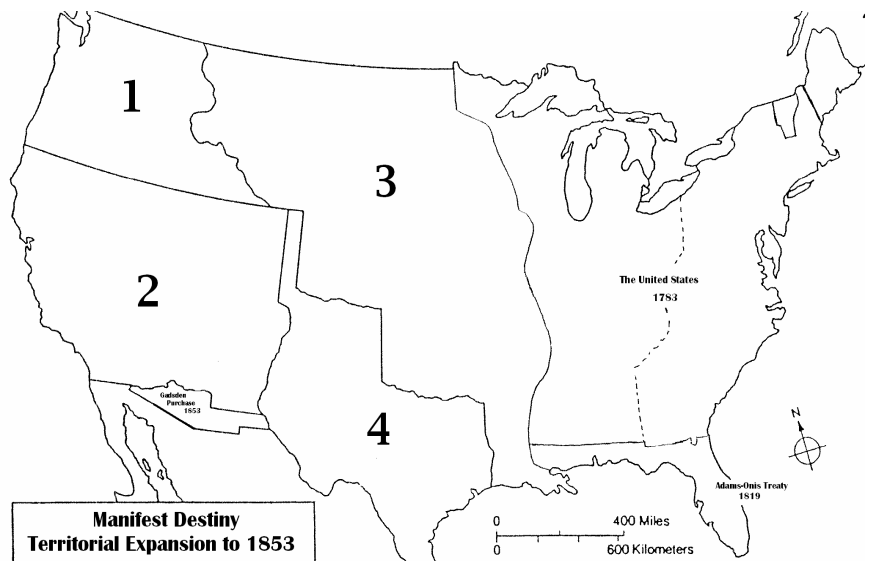

- IF (and only if) you read a test question and you have no idea what either the question or any of the possible answers mean, select (and stick to) your favorite letter (A-D).
- Write down facts, definitions, and key words in the margin of the test booklet so you won't worry about forgetting them!
- Don't worry about how fast other people finish their test; just concentrate on your own test.
- If you run out of time and you have blanks, bubble in your favorite letter! A blank is always wrong, but if you bubble in your favorite letter, you have a chance at getting it right! (Does not apply to SAT TEST).
